

LEGAL PROVISIONS

On the procedures of the International Contest of Young Architects

LETI: Future Academic Spaces

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1. These Provisions determine the procedures for the International Contest of Young Architects “LETI: Future Academic Spaces” (hereinafter Contest).

1.2. Contest objective: strengthen the positioning of Saint-Petersburg State Electrotechnical University ‘LETI’ (hereinafter LETI) in the global research & education space, create internationally friendly environment: comfortable, inclusive and motivating for students, educators, researchers and visitors.

1.3. Contest objectives:

- promote LETI as an interesting and comfortable place for learning and work;
- attract attention to the valuable historical heritage and traditions of LETI;
- produce and disseminate the experience of the unique inter-university project;
- involve students into the socially and historically important projects.

1.4. The Contest is organized by:

- Saint-Petersburg State Electrotechnical University ‘LETI’;
- Saint-Petersburg State University of Architecture and Civil Engineering, SPbGASU.

1.5. Contest subject: architecture & design concepts for the development of LETI public spaces in Accordance with Technical Assignment.

1.6. A participant can submit the unlimited number of design projects.

1.7. Contest stages and milestones:

- Contest is announced and contestants can submit applications in March 2021;
- Deadline for submitting conceptual designs — May 25, 2021;
- Jury meeting to choose finalists (about 20 design projects) - end of May 2021
- Panel exhibition of finalists with a possibility to present projects June – September 2021;
- Award ceremony — September 2021.

1.8. The Jury members are invited by the Organizing Committee. The Jury members are: representatives of the LETI Directorate, Student council, representatives of SPbGASU, international architects, designers and experts.

1.9. Finalists and winners will be determined by scores given by the Jury members to the submitted projects and in accordance with the Provisions criteria.

2. PROJECT SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

2.1. Project submission package:

- Submitted projects are sent as PDF presentations, authors not mentioned. File size not larger than 30 Mb, and additionally as JPG images (resolution not higher than 300 dpi,

A4). Project concept explanation, a text file in the DOC format (below 3 000 characters). All submitted documents (project files) have the applicant's motto, which may contain letters and numbers, not more than 10 characters.

- The Concept visualizes main zones of the site or space in accordance with Technical assignment. It also can include plans, cross sections, etc. to present the authors' idea in full detail. The number of images is not limited.
- The Concept is submitted with the completed Application form (Attached), where all names and contacts of the team can be mentioned.
- Submission deadline is May 25. Applicants, which are chosen as finalists, send their photos and their project panel (poster) for exhibition in the public spaces of LETI. They get the template for the panel from the Organizing committee.

3. ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

3.1. Compliance of the submitted project to the Contest objectives and Technical assignment.

3.2. Project implementation feasibility.

4. RESULTS AND AWARD CEREMONY

4.1. All submitted projects are viewed, discussed and assessed by the Jury at the end-of-May session.

4.2. The Contest finalists are chosen for each nomination/site in accordance with Technical assignment.

4.3. All participants will get the 'Contest Participant's Certificate'. All finalists will get the 'Contest Finalist Diploma'. They will be awarded with valuable prizes, and winners will be offered traineeships in the Russian and/or international architectural and design bureaus or companies. They also can get contracts within projects for the LETI academic spaces renovation.

5 PROCEDURE FOR THE USE OF THE SUBMITTED CONCEPTS DURING THE CONTEST AND AFTER IT

5.1 By accepting these terms and conditions, the Participant guarantees that he/she has exclusive rights to the work submitted for the Contest.

5.2 The submitted concept is not a working project and is not subject to implementation on the pilot sites and/or any other sites of the Customer without the appropriate consent of the author (contestant).

5.3 At the end of the Contest, all works submitted by contestants may be used by the Organizers as exhibits for the final exhibition. The concepts may be published in the media, placed on the Internet and used in internal materials of SPb GETU "LETI" (albums, presentations, etc.) subject to mandatory mentioning of the authors' names.

5.4 In the event of claims by any third party to the Contest Organizer and/or the Customer related to the placement of the submitted concepts in the mass media, Internet, etc. and/or to their publication considered as violation of intellectual property rights, the contestant undertakes to settle the third-party claims by his own efforts and at his own expense.
